<b>American Cancer Society</b>  Road to Recovery	(800) 227-2345	Road to Recovery Program matches volunteers with people who are undergoing cancer treatments. Volunteers transport cancer patients to treatment and related medical appointments. 3 business days notice is needed for ride requests.
<b>Catholic Community Services</b>  Volunteer Transportation	(425) 257-2111	Volunteer transportation for health care, shopping and essential errands. During times of funding constraints priority will be given to medical transportation. Rides are contingent upon availability of volunteers. Application required.
<b>Catholic Community Services</b>  Veterans Transportation	(425) 257-2111	Provides transportation services for disabled veterans living in rural Snohomish County to doctor appointments and other essential errands. Will transport in to King County.
<b>Community Transit</b>  Fixed Route Bus Service	(425) 353-7433	Offers bus transportation. Reduced fares for seniors and disabled persons in Snohomish County. Wheelchair accessible service on all routes.
<b>Community Transit</b>  Regional Reduced Fare Permit	(425) 348-2350	Reduced fare for seniors 65+ and disabled persons. Permit can be obtained and used in a variety of counties and transit systems. Call Community Transit for more information and permit application. Permit is \$3.00.

<b>Disabled American Veterans Transportation Program</b> Disabled Veterans Transportation Program	(206) 764-2564	Transportation for disabled veterans with medical appointments scheduled at the Veterans Puget Sound Health Care Center in Seattle. Must be ambulatory. Vans are not wheelchair equipped. No charge for ride.
<b>Everett Transit System</b> Fixed Route Bus Service	(425) 257-7777	Offers bus transportation. Reduced fares for seniors and disabled persons in the Everett area. Wheelchair lift-equipped service on all routes
<b>Everett Transit System</b> Everett Paratransit	(425) 257-8801	Transportation within Everett city limits for seniors 62+ and/or disabled persons. Must complete application to determine eligibility, which takes 3 weeks to process. 1-7 days advance notice to schedule rides. \$1.00 per ride each way.
<b>Paratransit Services (Medicaid Transportation)</b> Medicaid Transportation	(877) 852-2580	Transportation for Medicaid recipients needing rides to and from medical, dental and counseling appointments. All rides must be arranged at least two business days in advance. Out-of-county trips must be pre-authorized. No Fee.
<b>Senior Services of Snohomish County</b> Transportation Assistance Program - TAP	(425) 423-8517	Provides transportation for older adults and people with disabilities outside the DART service area. Two-week notice preferred for scheduled rides. \$1.50 per ride each way.
<b>Senior Services of Snohomish County</b> Dial a Ride Transportation (DART)	(425) 347-5912	Curb-to-curb transportation for people whose medical condition or disability prevents them from using regular fixed-route buses. Application required to determine eligibility (up to 3 weeks to process). \$1.75 per ride each way.
<b>Snohomish County Transportation Coalition</b> Pay Your Pal	(425) 265-2266	Riders eligible for this program live in rural parts of Snohomish County, have a disability, and need transportation for employment, education, or medical care. Through this program, the volunteer driver is reimbursed for miles driven.
